	SCRIPTURAL CONTENT nsider the following seven facts about eschatological information in the Bible, especially Christ's second ming:	
1.	In Scripture, out of 66 books contain predictive information.	
2.	In the Bible percent (8,352) of all verses (31,124) refer to prophetic issues.	
3.	In God's Word, percent (1845) of all prophetic verses (8352) refer to Christ's second coming.	
4.	All authors of the New Testament mention Christ's second coming.	
5.	Next to the subject of faith/salvation, the theme of Christ's is most prominent in the New Testament.	
6.	Only out of 27 New Testament books do not mention Christ's second advent.	
7.	Of the approximately specific biblical prophecies dealing with Christ's two advents, one third deal with His first coming and two-thirds deal with His second coming.

1.	Fulfilled prophecy proves that the Bible is true and inspires in Scripture (Acts 13:32-35 with 42-44).
2.	The study of prophecy promotes and provides the gateway to God's blessing (Revelation 1:3, 22:7).
3.	Prophetic material the saints to refute those who mock the Christian hope (2 Peter 3:1-13).
4.	Prophecy provides answers to questions that are found nowhere else, such as the relationship between the resurrection and the rapture (1 Thessalonians 4:13-18).
5.	Prophecy gives for holy living today (1 Thessalonians 5:6-9; Titus 2:11-14; 2 Peter 3:11-13).
6.	Prophetic expectation (1 John 3:2-3)
7.	Prophecy provides a biblical basis for (cf. Daniel 9:1-19 with Jeremiah 25:11-12).
8.	Prophecy is a of hope, comfort and encouragement for the Christian (1 Thessalonians 4:18; 5:11; Titus 2:13).
9.	The study of prophecy encourages patient in the midst of suffering and trials (James 5:7-11).
10.	Prophecy assures that unjust persecution of the righteous will be by God (2 Thessalonians 1:5-10).
